Identify the role and responsibility of a Process Facilitator; Utilise the key steps in process facilitation to keep participants focus and on task. Identify and utilise divergence tools to engage participants for idea collection and generation. Identify and utilise convergence tools to support participants in decision making.

Pivotal Learning - Process Facilitation
