Big Bill Broonzy said she could "pick a guitar and sing as good as any man I've ever heard", and her songs have been covered and reworked by the likes of Jefferson Airplane and Led Zeppelin.

The History of Rock Music - The 2000s

Disc jockey Alan Freed began a rhythm-and-blues show on a Cleveland radio station. Soon the audience grew and grew, and Freed coined the term "rock and roll." Early attempts by white artists to cover R&B songs resulted in weaker renditions that bled the heart and soul out of the originals.
